

## Year One Curriculum Map Summer 2

Maths	Children will be recapping the main areas of the maths curriculum (addition, subtraction, multiplication and counting) and will also revise any areas of difficulty.
English	They will be learning to read and write a set of instructions. They will use the key features, link I to their understanding of non-fiction texts and use their phonics to spell words independently.
Handwriting	Children will develop their fine motor skills and focusing on the position of their letters on the page. They will ensure letters are proportionate in height and are the same size.
Reading	Children will take part in reading gem groups daily which will work on a range of skills from retrieval of information to comprehension of a text. They will also have the opportunity to visit the library during curriculum time.
History	Children will compare the lives and reigns of Queen Elizabeth 1 and Queen Victoria. They will look at timelines and compare fashion from the two eras. They will look at the role of a monarch and develop an understanding of British values of the past.
DT	Children will design and make their own picnic lunch. To do this they will look at healthy eating, sample different foods and practise preparing different fruit. They will use these skills to design their own picnic after making and eating this they will evaluate what they have done.
R.E.	Children will be thinking about "What makes some places sacred?" They will be considering the terms sacred and holy, think about the idea of respect in religions and how this is demonstrated. Children will look at places of worship and compare a mosque and a church, they will discuss the impact of features within worship. Children will also look at the use of song and prayer within worship.

PSHE	The focus will be "changing me". The children will think about changes as they grow and parts of the body.
P.E.	Children will be developing their gym skills by using a range of equipment to complete balances and positions. They will also play net and wall ball games outside and learn the key skills to transfer into a game situation.
Music	Children will continue to play different instruments and create rhythms whilst practising their singing.
