Cross Country events

On Friday 15th and 22nd November, Wyre Forest School Sport Partnership's annual Cross Country events took place.

On 15th, over 540 pupils from a record 28 Primary Schools took part in the KS2 event, which took place at Memorial Park in Stourport. Races took place for Y5 girls, Y5 boys, Y6 girls and Y6 boys, with the top 5 place runners from each school, earning points for their team. The competition was split into small and large schools. Hagley won the large schools competition, with Burlish Park in 2nd and Cookley in 3rd. St Wulstan's won the small schools competition, with St Ambrose in 2nd and Hartlebury in 3rd.



The following week, in the Wyre Forest, the KS3/4 Cross Country took place.

There were races for girls and boys in Y7, Y8/9 and Y10/11, with runners covering increasing longer distances.

Y7 girls: 1st - Haybridge, 2nd - Stourport, 3rd - Holy Trinity.

Y7 boys: 1st - Bewdley, 2nd - King Charles, 3rd - Baxter.

Y8/9 girls: 1st - Bewdley, 2nd - Haybridge, 3rd - Holy Trinity.

Y8/9 boys: 1st - Bewdley, 2nd - Hagley, 3rd - Haybridge.

Y10/11 girls: 1st - Baxter, 2nd - Bewdley, 3rd - King

Y10/11 boys: 1st - Haybridge, 2nd - Baxter, 3rd - Holy Trinity.

Overall winners: The Bewdley School.

The top placed athletes will now progress to their respective County Finals as Wyre Forest representatives.



Y3/4 Kho Kho Festival

On Friday 6th December, Y3/4 pupils from 16 Primary Schools took part in a Kho Kho Festival - an Indian Tag game.
