Start of building works

As we recently informed you, due to exciting expansion work, we will be relocating all our classes from the Wyre Forest hub to the main building with effect from September 2023. We are excited to say that work will commence next week on flattening part of the bank around the playground and on the installation of the necessary infrastructure in order to facilitate the temporary classrooms.

As a result, the lower field will be fenced off for the remainder of the summer term to allow access to the site for the contractors and their equipment. This will not affect the playground itself at the moment and parents, carers and children will be able to access the site as normal.

During the summer holiday, more work will take place to install the temporary classrooms as well as to remove the breakfast club mobile to accommodate a further outdoor play area. This work will be completed for the start of the autumn term. We will continue to keep you informed of progress during the course of the summer months.
