

# Year One Curriculum Map Summer 1

Maths	Multiplication- The children will be learning to count in twos, fives and tens up to 100. They will also solves simple problems using these skills.
English	The children will be looking at a range of Julia Donaldson books and continuing to develop key skills relating to sentence structure including punctuation (capital letter, full stop and finger spaces). They will be challenged to use question marks and exclamation mark and create their own pieces of writing.
Handwriting	Children will develop their fine motor skills and practising matching lower case and capital letters. . Some children will be introduced to pre-cursive handwriting in preparation for Year 2.
Reading	Children will take part in reading gem groups daily which will work on a range of skills from retrieval of information to comprehension of a text. They will also have the opportunity to visit the library during curriculum time.
R.E.	Children will be developing their understanding of Islam. They will find out about Muslim beliefs with regards to Allah, the prophet Muhammad (pbuh). Children will look at and draw meaning from some stories in the Qu'ran and find out about objects that are significant to Muslim's. They will also learn about some Muslim celebrations and compare them to Christian celebrations.
PSHE	Children will be thinking about friendships and relationships. They will discuss what appropriate touch is for them and ways they like to greet different people. They will also look at the people who can help in the community.
Art	Children will create a hedgehog out of clay. They will research hedgehogs looking at their colour, shape and texture and recreate this in their model. They will learn how to pinch, roll and carve clay using their fingers and other tools.

Science	Plants and trees- the children will be learning about the parts of a plant and a tree and what jobs they do. They will also have the chance to find different types of trees and find out if they are evergreen or deciduous.
P.E.	Children will be developing their Dance skills by creating action and representations to music. They will also be practising their athletics skills outside by doing jumping, running and throwing activities.
Music	Children will continue to play different instruments and create rhythms whilst practising their singing.
