## **Attendance Matters for our children**



You can demonstrate your commitment to your child's education by not taking holidays during term time. Any child who is absent from school will miss out on important learning.

In each academic year there are only a maximum of 190 statutory days which allows plenty of time for holidays to be arranged out of term time. Any leave taken during term time will be categorised as unauthorised.

As with attendance, even missing small portions of the school day quickly builds up:

- 5 minutes late every day = 3 days lost over a year
- 10 minutes late every day = 6 days lost over a year
- 15 minutes late every day = 10 days lost over a year
- 20 minutes late every day = 13 days lost over a year

Exceptional leave in term time:

You need to obtain permission from the Headteacher if you want to take your child out of school in term time.
