On Friday 3rd May, Y254 5/6 pupils from Sutton Park, Holy Trinity, Chaddesley Corbett, St Bartholomew's, Hagley, Franche, Bewdley, Lickhill, Upper Arley, Stourport, Blakedown, Cookley, Burlish Park, St John's, St Anne's, Wilden, St Oswald's, Foley Park, Heronswood, Birchen Coppice and Heathfield Knoll Primary Schools attended a Y5/6 Orienteering Festival in the grounds of Wolverley CE Secondary School. Pupils competed in teams of 4, 2 boys and 2 girls, and had to

stay together, to complete the course in the fastest possible time.

There were 5 sessions that the Primary Schools could attend and teams were 'sent out' in waves so that there was sufficient distance between pupils.

Franche were the winning large school, completing the course in 17.17 minutes, with Burlish Park (17.29) in 2nd and St Anne's (19.04) in 3rd. Blakedown (19.01) won the small schools event, with teams from Heathfield Knoll

(21.29 and 23.23) finishing 2nd and 3rd.

Y7/8 students completed a similar course in the afternoon.

Haybridge Z (13.12) won the event, with Wolverley (13.58) finishing in 2nd and Haybridge's L (14.15) team finishing in 3rd.

The event was supported by Harlequin's Orienteering Club who spoke to schools about continuing their orienteering outside of school.

Y3/4 and Y5/6 Tennis

On Tuesday 21st May, Y3/4 and Y5/6 pupils from Burlish Park, Holy Trinity, St John's, Hagley, Franche, Stourport and Lickhill Primary Schools took part in the SSP's Tennis Festival, held at Stourport Tennis Club. The event was supported by Stourport's Head Coach, Gerard Tilt and 17 Young Leaders from Stourport High School and Heathfield Knoll.

Teams played in 2 mini-leagues, with the winners of each league playing-off to determine an overall winner. All of the pupils involved in the Festival were non-rated players, meaning they don't currently play competitive Tennis for a club.

Playing mini-Tennis Red, the Y3/4 team and the Y5/6 from Hagley both won their respective competitions.

These pupils will now represent the Wyre Forest at the Summer School Games on July 2nd, competing against teams from the other Worcestershire's Districts.

Athletics events

On Friday 10th May, 114 students from Heathfield Knoll, Bewdley, King Charles, Baxter College, Stourport and Haybridge High Schools competed in a Super6 Athletics event at Stourport Athletics track. Competing in teams of 12, all

athletes had to take part in a track, field and relay event. The Bewdley School won the Y7 competition and Stourport High won the Y8 competition. Following this, 110 pupils from Burlish Park, Offmore, Holy Trinity, Hagley, St John's, St Mary's, Blakedown, St

Anne's, Franche, Comberton and Bewdley Primary Schools took part in a KS2 Athletic Activities festival, targeting less active pupils. Rotating round 6 activities, pupils experienced sprinting, hurdling, 1 lap races, long jump, javelin and hammer.

Young Leaders from King Charles supported the event and handed out awards for pupils who demonstrated the School Games Values of Passion, Honesty, Determination, Self-belief, Teamwork and Respect.
